## Departmental Reports

- *Hartford Marathon road closures* - More than 7,000 runners will be on West Hartford roads for the 2017 Eversource Hartford Half Marathon on October 14, 2017. Road closures will be in effect from about 8:00 AM to 10:00 AM. Motorists may be allowed to drive through the closed area if there is a large enough break between runners. The safety of the runners is the priority.

For best access to and from the area enclosed by the race route, we recommend using the Sisson Avenue highway entrances and exits (#46) on I-84. Thank you for your support and cooperation!

The effected streets include Park Road, Whiting Lane, South Quaker Lane, South Highland, the Boulevard, North Quaker Lane, Fern Street, Trout Brook Drive (Northbound lanes), Albany Avenue between Steele Road and Trout Brook (eastbound lanes), Steele Road and the interior roads of Elizabeth Park

- *Renée McCue joins Town Manager's Office* - Renée McCue will be transferring from the Community Development Department to the Town Manager's Office later this month. She brings with her 29 years of experience in public communication and a breadth of knowledge across all municipal departments. She will continue her work in the same capacity while adding a new focus of communication from the Office of the Town Manager.
- *Motor Vehicle Tax bills mailed 10/6* - The Town mailed motor vehicle tax bills to West Hartford residents based on the current State legislation of 32 mills. The

Town had delayed the mailing of the bills since June as the state deliberated on its budget. With the State budget still uncertain, the Town can no longer wait. Motor vehicle tax bills are due November 1. The last day to pay without penalty is Dec. 1. The tax office will be open on December 1, from 8:30AM to 4:30PM. Should there be a mill rate change when the final State budget is adopted, the Town may issue a supplemental tax bill at a later date. Your understanding regarding the timing of the motor vehicle bills is appreciated.

- *Fire Station Open House* - The West Hartford Fire Department will hold an Open House at Station #2, 20 Brace Road, on Wednesday, October 11, 5:00-9:00 PM, during National Fire Prevention week. The event is free. Stop by to learn safety tips to protect your home and family.
- *Flu Immunization Clinics* - Influenza is a serious disease that can lead to hospitalization and sometimes even death. Since every flu season is different, an annual immunization is recommended. The West Hartford/Bloomfield Health District will provide flu shots on:
  - October 18 - West Hartford Town Hall Auditorium, 12:00-2:00 PM
  - October 20 - West Hartford Senior Center, 15 Starkel Rd., 10:00 AM-12:00 PM
  - October 25 - Elmwood Community Center, 1106 New Britain Ave., 10:00 AM-12:00 PM

- *Sunday hours resume* on October 15 at the Noah Webster Library, 20 South Main Street. Sunday hours are 1:00-5:00 PM.
- *Curbside Composting Pilot Program* - Quantum Bio-Power reported that the first load from the pilot food waste diversion program collected from more than 100 participating homes totaled one ton! The pilot program will run 4 months and is made possible by partnering Covanta Energy, Quantum Bio-Power and Paine's Inc. West Hartford is the only town testing a municipal source separation collection of residential food waste.
- *EV Chargers in Town Hall Parking Lot* - Department of Public Works recently installed a dual-head EV charging station in Town Hall parking lot. The unit was purchased with a grant from CT Green Bank. The remaining cost of the EV charger, labor and materials to install the equipment were sponsored by Municipal Parking Division.

The EV Chargers are available for public use. It can charge up to two electric vehicles simultaneously. The location is handicap accessible. The project was a shared effort among several departments/divisions including Plant & Facilities, Engineering, Streets Division and Municipal Parking.

- *LED Lighting on Garages' Roofs* - Department of Public Works, Traffic Safety Division, recently completed the conversion of the garages rooftop lighting from 250w metal halide lumens to 50w LED lights. The objective is to conserve

electricity, prevent vandalism and improve safety at the garages' roof levels. By deploying LED technology, we minimize the long term maintenance costs associated with expensive ballast and bulb replacement. The electricians continue with the lighting improvement project to include Isham Garage wall units and Farmington parking lot light pole.

- *Leaf Bag collection begins October 23* - Autumn is a wonderful season until it's time to rake leaves! DPW will run its 10-week curbside leaf bag collection on October 23rd through to December 29. Leaves should be placed in 30-gallon biodegradable paper bags. Plastic bags will not be collected. Place the paper leaf bags at the curb, but not in the street. Public works recommends that you continue to mow your lawns weekly to help reduce the volume of fallen leaves by mulching the leaves in place.

If you hire a local landscaper to collect your leaves by truck or a vacuum system, please remind them that leaf piles are not allowed in the street because they create serious safety issues for passing motor vehicles, bicyclists, and pedestrians, and cause local street flooding by damming the catchbasin. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

- *Essie Labrot named Town Clerk of the Year* - At the Connecticut Town Clerks Association's conference on September 28th, Essie Labrot was awarded "Town Clerk of the Year," the highest award that the association bestows each year. The winner is selected by all 169 Town Clerks as the person they feel has done the most for the association and the residents of her community. Essie was one of five finalists. Of note, Essie's testimonies, research, presentations and volunteerism set her apart from the other candidates.
- *Absentee ballots* - Absentee ballots are now available in the Town Clerk's office for the November 7, 2017 Municipal Election. If you will be out of town or not able to make it to the polls on Election day due to illness, disability, military service, election duties or religious reasons, you are eligible to vote by absentee ballot.

- *News from The Bridge Family Center* - The Bridge wants to remind the community members that the West Hartford Teen Center is a thriving, fun place for West Hartford Teens to socialize after school for basketball, billiards, video games, and that it has Teen Night one Friday per month. The Teen Center is located in the basement of the Elmwood Community Center.

The Bridge is also continuing to run its Kids in Divorce and Separation support groups at the West Hartford elementary schools. Children who are separated from a parent or caregiver due to divorce, separation, incarceration, or military service are welcome to attend this group.
