- 1. Opening / Call to order 7:07 PM
 - a. Roll call

b. Approval of minutes - November, December

Approved, subject to correction that Nathaniel Goldschmidt was in attendance at Nov meeting.

2. New Business

a. Guest Speaker – Duane Martin, Director of Community Development Duane Martin gave a presentation (attached) which provided an overview of his department, staffing and priorities areas, including WH Center Master Plan, stormwater, low impact development, MS4, complete streets, and traffic safety. There was discussion/Q&A about how the Commission could support efforts and be more involved. Topics of interest included more education & outreach to residents; how to accelerate the development of sustainability-related policy and ordinances (e.g., LID, impervious surface, EV charging, dark night skies, energy efficiency), the Town's ability to influence (or require) local development to be more sustainable and/or energy efficient, residential incentives, public transportation, reducing impervious surface (West Hartford will struggle to meet new MS4 permit mandated reduction goals of 2% in 2022, and 1% each year after), and sustainable landscaping. Todd Dumais, Town Planner, was identified as a key guest speaker for the next Commission meeting.

b. Booth for Celebrate West Hartford! - vote

Approved 5-0. The Commission voted to have a booth at Celebrate WH in June 2023. Catherine will fill out non-profit application and ask Bob Palmer for funding. This is a regular annual activity of the Commission. The Commission provides volunteers to staff the booth and conducts education and outreach on sustainability topics and initiatives. The educational focus of this year's booth will be discussed at a future meeting.

c. Working group – Sustainable landscaping (incl. electric lawn equipment), gardens, pollinator pathways, etc.

Deferred to next meeting. Noted by Kim Hughes and Emilee Scott that working group could still proceed (in accordance with quorum rules) in intervening time between meetings. Helen Rubino-Turco (Director of Leisure Services) and Justin Andrews (Grounds) were identified as guest speakers for future meeting. d. Wyland Foundation National Mayor's Challenge for Water Conservation –<u>https://wylandfoundation.org/programs/national-mayors-challenge-for-water-conservation/#</u> – vote?

Catherine indicated that Mayor Cantor asked the Commission to consider whether West Hartford should participate and promote this Challenge which happens in April 2023. Discussion/vote deferred to next meeting and should include discussion of Commission's point of view and clear messaging to public regarding water conservation and water quality in context of local MDC conditions (ample water supply).

3. Old Business:

a. Sustainable West Hartford Commission – status update: ordinance, logo, etc. Catherine provided update that ordinance was assigned to Gina Varano (Deputy Corp Counsel). Gina has reviewed draft and needs to meet with Town Manager to discuss revisions. There is still general support to merge the Commissions.

b. Plan priorities for 2023 – no discussion

4. Staff Report – no discussion

5. Public Comment

Chris Feely asked about the status of the \$140,000 in sustainability projects, which included pollinator gardens. She was concerned that Commission is not in the communication loop. Catherine indicated that Helen Rubino-Turco (Director of Leisure Services) is the lead on those and said recently that they had not kicked off yet. Kim Hughes, Emilee Scott and Sean Daly previously volunteered to be Cons & Env't Commission reps for the projects. Helen their contact info.


Chris also advocated for the Town to pursue solar canopies, especially on large parking lots like Conard HS, Hall HS, and Town Hall. People's Action for Clean Energy has published a report that outlines how solar canopies could supply, locally, most of West Hartford's energy needs. <u>https://pacecleanenergy.org/solar-canopies/</u>. Proposed HB 6052: AN ACT CONCERNING INCREASING SOLAR CANOPIES IN THE STATE also supports solar canopies.





FLOOD MITIGATION IMPROVEMENT AREAS







6 Minimum Control Measures

- 1. Public Education and Outreach
- 2. Public Involvement/Participation
- 3. Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE)
- 4. Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control
- 5. Post Construction Stormwater in New Development or Redevelopment
- 6. Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping

In addition: Outfall Testing/IDDE/DCIA

- ✓ Drain pool water to the sanitary sewer.

ILLICIT DISCHARGE DETECTION AND ELIMINATION (IDDE)

- Developed separate IDDE Program
- Added IDDE items to "Report a Problem" application
- Updated Town's GIS storm drainage layer
- Established an Ordinance to pursue IDDE
- Sample outfalls regularly to monitor and eliminate IDDE
 - Dry/Wet Weather sampling Outfalls to Impaired waters
 - Interconnection sampling

CONSTRUCTION SITE STORMWATER RUNOFF CONTROL
 Review development applications for stormwater quality controls

POST-CONSTRUCTION STORMWATER IN NEW DEVELOPMENT OR REDEVELOPMENT

- Establish guidelines pertaining to Low Impact Development
- Calcluate Directly Connected Impervious Area
 - ▶ 14.4% or 2,066 acres (2% reduction = 41.3 acres, 1% reduction = 20.7 acres)

POLLUTION PREVENTION/GOOD HOUSEKEEPING


